This award recognises efficient use of materials in construction and commitment to the reduction of construction waste. It will reward best practice initiatives that minimise onsite waste, manage waste effectively for recycling and the use of recovered and recycled materials. Companies that can demonstrate their commitment to these can provide details of their activities. The award is open to both private and public sector clients, contractors, manufacturers, engineers, consultants and architects.

Entrants need to provide a statement of up to 800 words including a 250 word statement on why you deserve to win this award and include photographs to illustrate highlighted projects or innovations. Please provide this information on no more than four pages of A4 (this entry form will not be counted in the limit).

Please provide two copies of all entry material including the entry form.

JUDGING CRITERIA

In your submission please provide information on the following points:

- Summarise why your company deserves to win this award in 2010.
- Provide two examples of projects where your service input or product tangibly improved the energy performance of the building or reduced the carbon footprint of the structure.
- Please provide evidence of company's strategy and activities to promote sustainability within your organisation.
- Are you a member of any organisation or association that promotes sustainable and responsible business practice?
- Do you have specific management with responsibility for sustainability: what are their key targets and how do they measure your company's performance.
- Have you introduced any new innovations in the last 12 months?
- Outline any R&D programmes aimed at improving the performance and specification of your products.
- Explain your company's approach to training.
- Do you have a long term target for sustainability - how do you plan to achieve that target and by when?
- What strategic steps has your company taken to sustain or develop its existing business over the next 12 months?

Essential tips for a successful entry

- A successful application must address all of the points above to be considered.
- Where we have asked for specific information use headings to highlight your answers to specific questions.
- Concentrate on facts that can be substantiated.
- Include information on your exceptional successes during the year such as business innovations or techniques that have reaped significant benefits.
- You can use bullet points, charts and photographs in your submission. Photographs are particularly important for the judges to be able to see your projects or innovations.
- Additional information will not be forwarded to the judges unless specifically requested.
- Please provide us with two copies of all entry material including the entry form. If you are shortlisted we will need additional copies and we will contact you in this instance.
